Dear Dr. Cullen,

Having the utmost respect for your financial acumen and common sense, I was shocked and dismayed to hear the groups represented on the tax working group. It seems inconceivable to me that there was nobody representing the considerable number of people on benefits.

I myself ran afoul of the tax system as I struggled on the DPB, raising my four children during the 1980's and 90's. Nearly 30 years later, the injustice of the system that limits beneficiaries' earnings, has not been examined, let alone changed. This obtuseness on the part of governments left or right, is a disgrace. It has effectively created an

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under-class of "dependent," "unemployable," stigmatised people, whose lives have been suffocated through their initiative being curtailed and thereby damaged. I myself have experienced the effects; I have made this point many times over the decades that I was "too lazy" to get off the benefit. It is a stigma that has cast a shadow over our entire family; being an intelligent & creative person, some people still believe that "living on hand-outs" is a personal "lifestyle choice."

I would have expected that you of all people would have the courage and compassion to investigate this matter. As far as I am aware, the limit for earnings if you receive a benefit, is \$80 (Eighty) dollars per week. Earnings beyond that, are progressively deducted so that (if, for example, you earn \$10, you end up with \$2 in the hand. I challenge you and your team to come up with a humane, encouraging formula instead.
